Stage One: Applying

Registrations can be made via our website which is found at [Admissions | Brighton College | Independent School of the Decade](#). Registration for 13+, 14+ and 16+ entry will close at the beginning of the September before entry. Should you have any questions ahead of making your child's application then please direct your enquiry to the relevant Admissions Coordinator:

For candidates applying via the Academic Asia 'Hong Kong Top Schools' event, registration will close at the beginning of the October before entry.

Stage Two: Interviews

After the Admissions Coordinator has received your application, your child will be invited to an individual interview. These are usually held in September or October the year before entry. Interviews are conducted in person or via Microsoft Teams.

Stage Three: Assessments

Our Coordinators will be in contact to help you make the necessary arrangements for your child. Assessments need to be held at an approved invigilation centre in the applicant's relevant city in the September / October before entry.

For candidates applying through Academic Asia, the assessments will be held in the October before entry.

All candidates will sit the College's assessments in English and mathematics. Candidates applying for 16+ will also sit a General Paper assessing critical thinking, writing and scientific reasoning.

We would encourage applicants to submit a UKiset report if English is not their first language.

Stage Four: Results

Results will be sent via email by the end of November before entry.

The deadline for acceptance of offers is early December.

As a licensed sponsor with UK Visas and Immigration (UKVI), the school can sponsor a non-UK nationality pupil for a Child Student study visa upon request.

A Child Student study visa is most suitable for full boarders. If you're applying for a day place or weekly boarding place, and the pupil would require a Child Student study visa, please contact our Visas Coordinator to discuss if sponsorship will be possible:
