School Uniform 2025/26

Consistency ('uniformity') within the expectations of pupil uniform can provide a haven from pressures and expectations on teenagers to wear the 'right' thing, the 'right' way, or to be adapting constantly to changing styles and trends. The rules below will be enforced by staff for these reasons.

General Rules for all pupils:

Pupils should be dressed smartly and should take pride in their appearance at all times.

- · Games kit should only be worn on games days, when pupils should wear the College games kit (not match-day or representative shirts and must be current limitless brand). The outer layers must be part of the core College games kit (the smock top, running jacket and heavyweight puffer coat all provide good top layer coverage). Tracksuit bottoms must be worn at all times when not training.
- No ostentatious appearance allowed.
- · Blazers or jackets must be worn at all times when in smart uniform. No cardigans or long jumpers which hang below the jacket are permitted.
- · Coats, scarves, hats and gloves should not be worn once in school except in inclement weather. In inclement weather, a plain dark overcoat or the College crested puffer coat may be worn.
- When wearing smart uniform, shoes must be formal in style, flat and black leather; no leather trainers or shoes with coloured laces/stitching. Sixth Form pupils may wear brown or navy shoes. Leather shoes must be kept well-polished.
- On games days, pupil must wear sports trainers rather than any alternative footwear such as sliders or plimsolls.
- · Socks should be ankle-length, plain, black and unbranded for pupils in the Third, Fourth and Fifth Forms. Sixth Form pupils must wear smart, ankle-length, non-sports socks. Tights should not have rips, holes or ladders.
- No jewellery may be worn for games.
- · Shirts/blouses must be tucked in.
- When worn, ties must be done up properly, tied at the collar.
- Hair must be neat in style and natural in colour no ostentatious hair styles or colours are allowed.
- · We welcome protective styles for Afro-textured hair. If pupils are in doubt, they should speak to their HMM.



- accordance with the rules set out in those dress codes.
- · Pupils must be clean shaven.
- A refillable (non-plastic) water bottle should be used.

The College uniform code applies to pupils between breakfast and 5pm.

• No make-up should be used by pupils in the Third and Fourth forms. In the Fifth Form and above, make-up should be discreet. Accessories such as eyelash extensions are not permitted for any age group. Nail varnish may only be worn by those in the Sixth Form in

Third, Fourth and Fifth Form

- White, long-sleeved **blouse** with College tie OR white open-neck revere blouse.
- Plain, black V-neck jumper.
- College knee-length skirt OR College tailored trousers.
- College tailored black bolero jacket.
- Plain black/neutral-coloured **tights** OR black ankle socks.
- **Shoes** must be smart in style, flat and black leather; no leather trainers or shoes with coloured laces/ stitching.
- Jewellery no piercings, except ear lobes: one pair of small stud earrings may be worn; no rings. A single discreet necklace and bracelet may be worn.
- In the Third Form, long hair must be tied up.

Sixth Form

'Smart and business-like'

- L6th: a dark matching skirt/dress/trouser suit;
- **U6th**: a dark matching suit, or smart jacket with trousers, skirt or dress.

Note: If U6th choose to wear non-matching trouser/skirt/ dress and jacket, they must be of suitable structured material and formal in nature, suitable for attending a formal job interview.

- Skirts or dresses must always reach to the top of the knee.
- A **blouse** or a shirt with collar and sleeves must be worn and tucked in.
- Jumpers should be plain coloured, V-neck and smart in design. These should not be chunky, patterned, made of fleece material, or have a zip-up neck. The blouse collar and top button must be visible.
- Plain, dark or neutral tights (in keeping with outfit).
- Smart dark leather shoes in black, navy or dark brown

 heels should be no more than two inches high;
 no stilettos, boots, no leather trainers or shoes with
 coloured laces/ stitching.
- Jewellery: piercings are only permitted to the ears, with up to two earrings permitted per ear. These should be studs or earrings with a drop of not more than 1 cm from the earlobe; a single, discreet necklace and bracelet may be worn; a single ring may be worn; no ankle bracelets or other jewellery is permitted.
- **Nail varnish** may be worn. Nails should not be overly long or hinder in the participation in school activities.

Third, Fourth and Fifth Form

| • White long sleeve shirt . |
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- College or House tie, tied at the collar.
- Plain, black V-neck jumper.
- College tweed jacket (second half of Michaelmas and Hilary term) OR College charcoal suit (first half of Michaelmas and Trinity term).
- **Trousers** must be of classics design and not be 'skinny fit'; black/dark belts with no large buckle may be worn.

• Plain, smart black socks.

- Smart black **shoes**; no boots, leather trainers or shoes with coloured laces/ stitching.
- **Hair** should be neat and tidy, above the collar in length, and not shaven. Hair bands must not be worn.
- No piercings or other jewellery are permitted.

'Smart and business-like' L6th: A dark matching suit; U6th: A dark matching suit, or sports jacket and smart trousers (not denim). Note: If U6th choose to wear non-matching trousers and jacket, they must be of suitable structured material and formal in nature, suitable for attending a formal job interview. Trousers - must be of classic design and not of a 'skinny fit'. Black/dark belts with no large buckle may be worn.

- Smart formal shirt (must be plain, fine pinstripe or fine check)
- School, House or Sixth Form **tie**, or representative tie (school colours, or a tie from county level representation or above), tied at collar.
- Smart black/ brown shoes; no boots, leather trainers or shoes with coloured laces/ stitching.
- Jumpers should be plain coloured, V-neck and smart in design. These should not be chunky, patterned, made of fleece material, or have a zip-up neck. The shirt collar and tie must be visible.
- Hair should be neat and tidy, above the collar in length and not shaven. Hair bands must not be worn.
- Nail varnish may not be worn.

Sixth Form

• Jewellery: a single, discreet necklace and bracelet may be worn; a single ring may be worn. No piercings or other jewellery may be worn.
