TIMELINE FOR SEPTEMBER 2020 ENTRY

Stage One: Enquiring

Making an enquiry is the first stage of the admissions process. At this point, the school will request a copy of the applicant's current school report. We encourage applicants to also submit a UKiset report. This helps both you and the College in determining whether Brighton College is the right choice for your child.

Stage Two: Registering

After the Admissions Co-ordinator has received your child's school report(s) and confirmed that the school would like to progress the application, the Co-ordinator will email you a registration form for completion and return, together with a registration fee. For 16+ applicants, this will be an online form.

Registration will close at **5.00 pm GMT on Friday 6th September 2019.**

For candidates applying via the Academic Asia 'Hong Kong Top Schools' event, registration will close on **Friday 4th October 2019.**

Stage Three: Assessments

Assessments will be held at a British Council office in the candidate's relevant city:

Hong Kong: Saturday 12th - Saturday 19th October 2019

Academic Asia 'Hong Kong Top Schools' Event:
Sunday 13th October 2019

All other countries: Monday 16th September - Friday 18th October 2019

Interviews are conducted either in person or via Skype.

Non-English native language speaking pupils will be required to attend English as an Additional Language (EAL) support lessons until the Head of the EAL Department is satisfied that the pupil has reached the standard of English required to study at a UK university.

As a 'Highly Trusted Sponsor' with the UK Visas and Immigration (UKVI), the school will sponsor a non-European Union (EU) nationality pupil for their Tier 4 study visa.
